Green Day – Wednesday 11th July



How much do you recycle? Do you use a keep cup when you visit the local coffee shop? Visit to the Migration Museum

On Monday 18th June, at the start of Refugee week, the YGA'S went to the Migration Museum. We have been working with the Migration Museum as part of Destination East Finchley. Whilst we were there, we got to read people's stories about how they came to England. Some of the stories were quite sad and some were quite interesting. One story we read was Ahmed Al-Rashid's story. He came to England from Syria. In 2012, he fled his home because of the war and went to Iraq. He lived in Iraq for two years but then ISIS arrived and took over the area he was in. He went to many more countries before he came here. On his way, he met a smuggler who gave him a fake passport and ID.

We also got to meet an author called Ele Fountain. She has written a book called Boy 87 which is about a young boy who is forced to leave his home and the story of his journey. It was really interesting to listen to her explain how she wrote her book and listen to some extracts.

Another area of the museum was a display of newspapers which had featured stories about migrants, refugees or asylum seeker. When we looked through the headings, we say that the language was mainly negative and there was not one story which was positive. We thought about how this could make people feel and considered how we could re-word the headings to have more of a positive impact.

It was a fascinating day, full of very interesting stories.

Swimming

3ZC are coming to the end of their term of swimming at Finchley Lido.

The children have made pleasing progress and all 30 children are now confident at going under the water. As part of the lessons for both Year 3 and Year 5 (booster sessions) the children are taught water safety and life saving skills. This involves all abilities of swimming; knowing how to enter the water in an emergency and feeling how clothes are when they are wet.

As the summer holidays are approaching I have included below the Water Safety Code to go through with your children. This is a reminder for all of us to be safe in and around any depth of water all year round.

 ALWAYS FOLLOW THE WATER SAFETY CODE Whenever you are around water: STOP AND THINK Look for the dangers. Always read the signs. STAY TOGETHER Never swim alone. Always go with friends or family. In an emergency: CALL 999 OR 112 Shout for help and phone 999 or 112. FLOAT If you fall in, float or swim on your back. Throw something that floats to anyone who has fallen in. 	 BEACH FLAGS  RED AND YELLOW LIFEGUARDS ON DUTY Between the flags is the safest place to swim.  RED DANGEROUS AREA Lifeguards are not watching this area. Do not swim here.  BLACK AND WHITE WATER SPORTS AREA Do not swim here.  ORANGE WINDSOCK SHOWS THE DIRECTION AND STRENGTH OF THE WIND Beware of winds blowing out to sea.
